## Welcome to Claralinga

Claralinga is a passion project from one language nerd to another: a love letter to words, roots, sounds, and the way language can bring people together.

It is designed to be simple, familiar, pronounceable, and welcoming to learners from many branches of the Indo-European family, and beyond. This Starter Kit gives you the fastest practical path into reading, speaking, and understanding the basics.

### The core promise

Understand more. Memorize less. Claralinga uses recognizable words, steady pronunciation, and simple grammar so learners can start communicating quickly.

v0.5 alignment note: This edition is aligned to Core 500 v0.6. Claralinga now uses k as the default /k/ spelling, keeps c only when it makes a word instantly recognizable, uses lingua as the official word for language, and treats Core 500 v0.6 as the current publik vocabulary authority.

Originality note: Claralinga is an original constructed auxiliary language created by Chad S. Bruce. It intentionally uses familiar international roots shared across modern Indo-European languages and is not a fork, revision, or derivative of another constructed language.

Not just Romance: Claralinga uses Latin and Romance-looking roots when they are already international, but it also considers Germanic, Slavic, Greek, Indo-Iranian, English international, and modern global vocabulary. Beginner clarity wins overall.

## How to Use This Starter Kit

4	Move to the Core 500, workbook, and graded reader.	Grow from starter phrases into real reading and speaking.

## Pronunciation in Five Minutes

Claralinga pronunciation is meant to be direct: every written letter is pronounced. No silent letters. No mystery meat.

u	oo	futur, kultura
c	retained k is default; soft c becomes s	clar, cel = kel

ch	English church	charta

### Stress rule

Stress usually falls on the next-to-last syllable: cla-ra-LIN-ga, fa-MI-li-a, de-mo-KRA-ti.

## Mini Lesson: Build Your First Sentences

Claralinga starts with a direct sentence pattern. Put the subject first, then the verb, then the object or description.

Subject	Marker	Verb	Object / rest
Mi		parla	Claralinga.
Tu	ne	komprende	la parola.
Nos	va	aprende	hodia.
Ela	nu	lege	un libro.
Les	pa	visita	la kentro.

### Pattern

Mi parla. Tu parla. Nos parla. The verb stem does not change by person. That is the whole point. No verb-table goblin hiding under the bed.
